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Foreword

Children go missing from the care of local authorities all the time. That's not an inflammatory headline, sadly, that is just fact, a reality of the times we live in.

The recent high profile child abuse cases have made it clear that protecting our children and young people is becoming more and more challenging. However, having said this, it is also clear that the current safeguarding systems many London Boroughs have in place are simply failing our children.



Children who are in the care of London Boroughs are called looked after children. The NSPCC report <u>"Children who go missing from care"</u> shows that looked after children are significantly more likely than other children to go missing, with those in residential care three times more likely to go missing than other children. These children face a significant risk of harm, and are likely to be exposed to the risk of alcohol and drugs, criminal and sexual exploitation and arrest. It's clear that these children are vulnerable and when a child goes missing from care they are at high risk.

Last year I conducted a study to take a measure of the problem across London. This year I have repeated that study. The purpose of this repeat study is to highlight just how serious this problem still is across London. The results, obtained by freedom of information requests submitted to 32 London Boroughs speak for themselves, revealing that a worrying problem still exists in every part of our city.

There is still a high number of recorded missing children from many boroughs, and still a failure by some London Boroughs to have accessible data relating to the children they are legally responsible for.

The numbers reflect a worrying trend. Young looked after children are going missing on a daily basis and London Boroughs need to prioritise supporting these young people to ensure we don't have a Rotherham type situation in London today.

As a mother and a former councillor I know that current standards need to be raised. I hope this report plays a role in pushing these issues up the agenda and leads to the standard of care we would all expect for our own children.

What's the problem?

Some of the country's most vulnerable children are disappearing from care, sometimes for hours or days and sometimes for months or even years.

At any given time, more than 30,000 children in England are in the care of local authorities. These authorities monitor the children's progress and oversee their placement in local authority-run children's homes or with foster-carers or other guardians. The authorities are supposed to keep track of what happens to children who officially leave the care system, logging them in categories such as children who are adopted, returned to parents or family, taken into foster care or those who have grown out of care. But children who do not fall into these categories—for instance, those who run away or end up homeless, abducted, trafficked or worse—are lumped into a category that the Department for Education simply labels "other," also known as "E8."

Last autumn, a review by the NSPCC showed that bad record-keeping has been a feature of the abuse scandals, including Rochdale. The review found that between 1979 and 1999, the Home Office had "lost or destroyed" 114 files relating to reported child abuse. This bad record keeping is not just at a national level, it's also at a local level.

How can we safeguard these children if proper records are not being kept when they go missing?

Aims

The term "looked after children" has a specific legal meaning based on the <u>Children Act</u>. A child is looked after by a local authority if he or she has been provided with accommodation for a continuous period of more than 24 hours¹, or is placed in the care of a local authority².

Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is a key duty of local authorities. When a child goes missing from care they are at risk. The risks children face if they go missing from care have been well demonstrated by the Rotherham child abuse case.

Ofsted statistics show that during the year 2013–14, 4,245 children and young people were reported to have gone missing from care – 900 more than in the previous year. These children went missing on 13,305 occasions – a 36% rise on the previous year. 528 of these children who went missing were deemed to be at risk of sexual exploitation, and 431 of the cases were said to be linked to substance misuse.

Last year I sent a freedom of information request (FOI) to all London Boroughs. I wanted to know how many children in their care had gone missing from placements and how many times these children had gone missing.

The responses were quite shocking³. Not only because of the sheer volume of vulnerable children who had gone missing with frightening frequency but also because of the boroughs varied responses. Across London, there seemed to be no cohesive way of recording when these children had gone missing. If this basic information isn't being recorded effectively, how can London Boroughs be effectively safeguarding the children in their care?

It was this question and the fact that the Department for Education has since published new statutory guidance for local authorities on children who go missing or runaway from care that led me to repeat this research. I wanted to see if, since my last FOI and since this guidance was published, fewer children are going missing from the care of our London Boroughs and how effectively the Boroughs are monitoring, safeguarding and caring for them.

I sent an FOI to every London Borough. I heard back from all boroughs except for Bromley and Hounslow. These two boroughs did not respond within the 20 day time limit set for responses under the Freedom of Information Act, despite my chasing.

Not every borough sent full information, although all information that was sent can be found in Appendix B.

Findings

The response to our freedom of information raised concerns. Out of 32 boroughs only 21 boroughs provided the information in full¹. We have directly comparable data from the years 2013 to 2014 for 11 boroughs², a sample of 31% of all London boroughs. The information provided by boroughs showed that:

- 888 children went missing from the care of London Boroughs from January 2014-15.
- These 888 children went missing 1,640 times.
- 446 children went missing from placements within their boroughs 717 times.
- 442 children went missing from placements outside their borough 923 times.
- In Enfield:
 - 110 children went missing from their care 251 times.
 - From 2013 2014 the number of children going missing from care increased by 358% from 24 to 110.
 - In the last two years 134 children have gone missing.
 - From 2013-2014 the number of children missing from Enfield in borough placements rose by 722% from 9 children in 2013 to 74 children in 2014.
- In Brent:
 - 93 children went missing from their care 172 times.
 - From 2013 2014 the number of children going missing from care increased by 94% from 48 to 93.



- In Camden
 - 65 children went missing from their care 151 times.
 - From 2013–2014 the number of children going missing from care increased by 51% from 43 to 65.
- In Southwark 56 children went missing from their care 142 times in 2014.
- In Lewisham from 2013 2014 the number of children going missing from care increased by 164% from 28 to 74.
- Within our sample of 31% of boroughs that had directly comparable data sets from 2013 to 2014 the number of children that went missing rose by 118%:
 - 231 children in 2013/14
 - 504 children in 2014/15
- Within our sample of 31% of boroughs that had directly comparable data sets from 2013 to 2014 the number of children that went missing from placements within their borough rose by 150%:
 - 88 children in 2013
 - 220 children in 2014
- Within our sample of 31% of boroughs that had directly comparable data sets from 2013 to 2014 the number of children that went missing from placements outside of their borough rose by 96%:
 - 143 children in 2013
 - 284 children in 2014


Figure 1: How many children went missing from care placements within their borough and how many times these children went missing in 2014.





Figure 3: How many children went missing from care placements inside and outside of their boroughs and how many times these children went missing in 2014-15.




Figure 4: How many children went missing from care placements within their borough in 2013 compared to 2014.

Recommendations

Recommendation 1:

The Mayor, who sits on the Congress of Leaders, should encourage every London Borough to review the support they give looked after children and ensure that the needs of these vulnerable young people are being fully met.

Recommendation 2:

At the next Congress of Leaders meeting The Mayor should suggest a review of data collection systems used by London Local Authorities. Encouraging a new system template be put in place and used across all London Local Authorities so that the information collected is both consistent and transparent.

Recommendation 3:

Data on how many looked after children go missing from the care of London boroughs should be uploaded to the London Datastore every month.

Recommendation 4:

Given that the Children Act 2004 requires each police authority (now, in London, the Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime (MOPAC)) and chief police officer of each police force to make sure they protect and promote the welfare of children, the Mayor should hold a summit inviting all London Local Authority leaders, safeguarding boards, MPS and MOPAC representatives as well as special interest groups to establish a Mayoral Task Force for vulnerable children to look at how we can better protect these at risk children who go missing from the care of London boroughs.

Recommendation 5:

At the next Congress of Leaders meeting the Mayor should encourage every London Local Authority to give every councillor corporate parent training and child sexual exploitation awareness training every year. These training packages should be reviewed and standardised across London.

Refusal Notice

Section 40 FOIA sets out an exemption from the right to know if the information requested is personal information protected by the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA).

The DPA which governs the processing of personal data and defines personal data "as any data which relate to a living individual who can be identified from those data, or from those data and other information which is in the possession of, or is likely to come into the possession of, the data controller."

Section 40 (2) FOIA exempts disclosure of information if such disclosure would contravene one of the data protection principles. This exemption is absolute and is not subject to the public interest test.

The first of the data protection principles requires that personal data is processed fairly and lawfully. It is our view that to disclose the withheld information would breach this principle, in particular, the requirement of fairness because the children have a reasonable expectation of privacy and do not expect that their personal information would be released in a response to a freedom of information request.



The cumulative time it would take Council officers to do this would exceed the "appropriate limit". Therefore, we are unable to disclose the information you are seeking as it would take our officers in excess of 18 hours.



In your original request of 2 January you asked various questions relating to children in the care of the borough that go missing, how many times and from what type of placement. You requested that the figures be broken down by month from 1st January 2014 to 31st December 2014.

We responded to your request on 29 January and explained that due to the low numbers involved in providing the figures broken down month by month as requested, that we believed it could lead to individual children being identifiable.

The response explained that if it were possible to identify the individuals involved (from the information that we provide and other information that may be available) it would be a breach of the Data Protection Act to disclose the information. Where it would breach the Data Protection Act to disclose information, that information is exempt from the Freedom of Information Act under Section 40(2).

Our general approach is not to provide a number when that number is 5 or less in order to minimise the risk of identification.

On 5 February you asked us to reconsider our decision and to provide you with the broken down figures. You indicated that other London Boroughs had done so.

I have reviewed your request and the response that we provided and, I am sorry to disappoint you but I do not agree that we should provide you with the monthly figures as you have requested. As explained if the number is less than five, we do not provide disaggregated figures to minimise any risk of identification.

The Information Commissioner's guidance on anonymising data suggests that when small numbers are involved, there is a possibility of re-identification of individuals by either the process of analysing the data or combining it with other data which may be available form other sources. This could result in the individuals becoming

identifiable. The guidance also suggests that small numbers in small geographical areas present an increased risk of this occurring. As we are referring to vulnerable children we tend to be cautious and so do not release information where the numbers involved are less than five.

I accept you report that other London Boroughs may have provided you with full data as you requested; however each local authority needs to make it's come decision all may be possible that if others have larger numbers then there is not the same risk of being identified.

I hope that you are satisfied with my response to the Internal Review. If you are dissatisfied, you may complain to the Information Commissioner, who may be able to help you. Please note that if you wish to refer this case to the Information Commissioner, they ask that you do so within two months of our response to you.



CHANGE CONTRACTOR

Under the Freedom of Information Act the Council has a right to refuse a request for information held if the cost of complying with a request exceeds the appropriate limit. The appropriate limit for local authorities is £450 or 2.5 days or 18 hours. We believe in this case such an exemption applies and has decided to refuse your request for information under section 12(1) of the Act.

Recording Practice Amendments

Between January and September, missing incidents for LAC cases of less than 24 hours were not recorded due in part to technical limitations in the recording method, as well as the police's view than until a child has been gone for this time period they should not be considered missing. Both of these concerns were resolved, and from October recording practice changed to record missing incidents of less than 24 hours. The recording process was also made much simpler for the worker, which, combined with increased focus from management on accurate recording, has resulted in the greater figures for the final months of 2014.

Result Definition

Tables a and c called for the number of total cases while b and d were total missing incidents. Because a monthly breakdown was requested, the same CASE would be counted once in each month they went missing 1 or more times.
